Earlier this week, I sent you a music ministry survey and invited your response. The purpose of the survey was not to initiate any particular change in musical style or content, but rather, to respond faithfully and intentionally to the change that is already upon us.

Our beloved long-time organist and choirmaster Eunice May will retire from her position as organist during the fall season. We grieve this, knowing that qualified organists are hard to come by and that Eunice is irreplaceable. Thankfully, Eunice has agreed to continue to lead our gifted choir into another year of worship and praise in song. We are so grateful for her ministry among us.

Meanwhile, our organ, which has been a source of musical inspiration to the parish for 40+ years, is nearing the end of its useful life. While that end may still be some years away (we hope), the computer technology that powers the organ is outdated, parts are no longer made for this very fine instrument, and its functionality decreases with each passing year despite regular maintenance and repair. One recent and unexpected repair, undertaken less than a month ago, totaled over \$1,000, with another \$1,650 recommended by our organ repair professional. The poet Adrienne Rich once mused, “The moment of change is the only poem.” For those of us who have lived a life this statement rings true. It is our task and sacred obligation, as the beloved of God at inevitable moments of change, to discover the poetry in it and discern the workings of our ever-creative God in the midst of the change that is.

Because every voice at St. Andrew is precious and integral to the Body of Christ, your rector and vestry turn to you, through the medium of survey, to tell us what you want and need to feed your spirit in worship through music. Your responses will guide us in staffing the church musician position. The Episcopal Church also guides us in this process by defining “approved music” for use at our principal Sunday service. We will seek a church musician who can play and lead the music we need for worship.

Please complete the music survey if you’ve not already done so (call the office if you need a survey sent to you by regular mail). The survey takes 3 minutes to complete.

Think of it as an act of stewardship. Whenever you engage in the life of the parish by completing a survey, participating in outreach, or simply praying for your brothers and sisters you are sharing your gifts as Jesus taught. Whenever you participate in a church committee, serve as an acolyte, lector, or Eucharistic minister, join choir or play an instrument in church you are sharing your gifts as Christ taught. Whenever you pledge or make a financial gift to church, stand for vestry, or attend church on Sunday you share your gifts with the community of souls that is St. Andrew and help to build the Kingdom of God in our time for the good of all.

Please plan to complete the music ministry survey by September 6. We look forward to sharing the survey results with you and moving forward together to make a joyful noise to the Lord through our mutual ministry of music.

WINTER CSA

Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) is a way for consumers to purchase local food directly from a farmer by purchasing a share of his harvest. St. Andrew is a pick-up location for the Geauga Family Farms CSA. The **winter program** runs for six-weeks beginning in late October. Shares are delivered to the church on a weekly basis. Many items in the shares will vary as the season progresses. Typical shares might include: Sweet potatoes, onions, carrots, parsnips, broccoli, radishes, lettuce, Swiss chard, eggs and whole-wheat bread.

Windows Update

We've had a small setback in our Window Replacement Project. When our contractor returned to update the quote we received when the Choir Room windows were replaced, it was discovered that a mistake had been made in measuring the small Sunday School room windows, and the quote was off by several thousand dollars. The cost to replace those windows is actually \$8400, and we have collected just over \$5200. The Vestry has decided to take \$2400 of what has been collected and replace the window in the Worman Room kitchen. It too is falling apart, and is in desperate need of replacement. Please don't be discouraged! Together we will make this improvement happen! Thanks to all who have donated to the Window Replacement Project! This is a long-term project and we will continue to work on replacing windows as we are able. The new windows look great and will last for years to come.
