GOOD NEWS FROM OUR SANCTUARY FAMILY

Laura M. who, with her two young sons, Joshua and Jose, lived with us at St. Andrew, in sanctuary, for two

years, just received some long-awaited good news from our Federal Government Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

Upon reviewing her U-VISA application (filed in April 2018) the DHS has determined Laura's application to be a "bona-fide" claim which will be approved for a U-VISA in the next fiscal year (DHS has reached its immigration quota for this year). In conjunction with this favorable determination on Laura's claim, the DHS will process her work permit, and work permits for her children (all of whom are now 16 or older) immediately. Soon, Laura will be able to work in the local economy to support herself and her children without threat of deportation.

Please know, friends, that, had the vestry of St. Andrew not taken the heroic step of offering Laura and her family sanctuary (we were one of only 80 churches in the US to take this step), and had our parish not embrace her, Laura would have been deported and her family separated. Without our help, Laura would not have been able to obtain legal counsel through the Case Law Clinic, and would not have been able to complete and file her U-VISA application, an arduous process, in and of itself.

In taking on this work of sanctuary, the parish of St. Andrew offered Laura and her family the sacrificial love of Christ. While I cannot speak to the specifics of her case in order to protect Laura's privacy, suffice it to say that we may well have saved her life.

Thank you, parish family, for embracing our sister Laura and her family, who were strangers in the US, and needed our immediate help to stay together as a family. We did Christ's work together; thanks be to God.

Last year we tried online ordering - while the service was convenient, it was also expensive. The church paid a 10% fee to use the fundraiser website and customers paid credit card fees. This year we are using a paper form (pick up at the Church) or one that can be downloaded from our website and electronically completed. Simply email the order form to

standrewflowersale@gmail.com or mail the form to the church. Pay either by paper check or by using your bank's bill pay service (in most banks this is free). Just add St. Andrew Episcopal Church, 7989 Little Mountain Road, Mentor, Ohio 44060 as a payee and instead of using an account number opt to add a memo - "Spring Flower Sale."

If you ordered last year, an order form will be emailed to you! Return flower orders between March 12th and April 16th and plants will be



available for pick up on Friday, May 19th - just in time for Memorial Day planting.

Please share order forms with your family, friends and neighbors! Pick up your flowers on Friday, May 19th between 1 and 6 PM.

LETTER REGARDING PARISH FINANCES

Dear Friends in Christ,

I write to share an update on the financial health of the parish.

In reconciling the books for the month of February, it became apparent to vestry that our monthly operational income, as averaged over the first two months of 2023, is insufficient to pay our monthly bills.

We will reach a crisis point this month which will require us to draw down on limited reserves to meet our financial obligations. Beginning in April, we will have no more reserves to draw from, and will be forced to default on some critical obligations.

The leadership of St. Andrew, your rector and vestry, are committed to creating a plan to increase our monthly income. This plan will require the active engagement of the entire community to implement.

We are one body, and every member is critically important to the health of the whole body. This teaching of Jesus holds true for all aspects of our ministry together, including our finances. We are so grateful for your support of St. Andrew parish. We ask you now to prayerfully consider how you might support us going forward.

Many parishes in the diocese are struggling to make ends meet in the wake of the COVID pandemic and declining memberships. Our church is not alone in operating with a deficit budget. All of us in Christ's body are seeking a way to continue the work of Christ together in our particular parish contexts.

For us at St. Andrew, the time is now.

Please know that the work we do now, together, to create and implement a financial plan for the parish that includes stewardship, space sharing, the sharing of clergy hours, and targeted fundraising, will

help ensure that St. Andrew remains a beacon of hope for generations to come.

Implementing such a plan, once developed, will take time however, and, as things stand, we will default on bill payments beginning in April.

Given our average monthly operational income and our operational expenses, we need an additional \$2,400 each month to meet our current financial obligations as a parish.

This amount could be met in straightforward fashion, if the 31 people who pledged this year would increase their monthly pledge by \$80. For some of our brothers and sisters in the community an \$80 increase in monthly pledging is possible, but for others, it is not an option. That is why the financial plan we develop together must not rely on pledges alone to meet our church expenses.

Please watch for your invitation to attend a parish meeting, on a date to be decided in the upcoming month, where we will discuss our church finances and our options for the future.

For now, please pray for the health of St. Andrew, Mentor. Pray for one another, and for those we serve. Come to church and worship with us. Consider a monetary gift, as you are able, to the St. Andrew general fund, whether it be an increase in pledge or a one-time gift. With your help, we will weather this storm and find a way forward, together.
