From the Rector

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. -Isaiah 11:1

Some of my favorite Advent imagery in scripture comes from Isaiah, most particularly in these words from Isaiah 11 which describe the coming of the Messiah in organic terms, as a new green shoot growing from a dead tree stump, seemingly spent and without life in it. That this green shoot continues to grow in us and through us is the good news we crave and are called to share with the world.

Wherever we dwell in the seasons of our lives, the scripture lessons we read together during Advent remind us that each of us is made new through the coming of our Savior. The community re-telling of the story of Jesus' birth through scripture, which we share in worship together during the Advent and Christmas seasons helps us ground our everyday lives in this reality: that the birth of Emmanuel, fully human and Divine, transformed the history of the world in an instant; and that his birth and his history continues to unfold in us today. We are, each of us, together, a part of the new creation God promised and Jesus initiated by his birth as one of us, to save all of us, by his love.

St. Andrew, Mentor, is a part of the new creation God promised. We, together, continue to unfold as a community to follow our Savior, as his agents of love in our time. We do this by sharing Holy Communion, praying, praising God, and serving God by serving one another and all creation, friend and stranger alike, with an open hand.

A NOTE FROM THE BENCH

Advent Greetings!

Each year as Advent begins the new Church year, I am drawn to one of my most favorite hymns.

The angel Gabriel from heaven came, his wings as drifted snow, his eyes as flame; "All hail," said he, "thou lowly maiden Mary, most highly favored lady," Gloria! The Hymnal 1982, #265

The archangel Gabriel is a bridge between the Old and New Testament. Gabriel transcends time and space and appears in dreams and visions in both the Old and New Testaments. (Haden, 2010)

In Daniel Chapter 8, we find Daniel trying to interpret a vision.

In the third year of King Belshazzar's reign, I, Daniel, had a vision, after the one that had already appeared to me. In my vision I saw myself in the citadel of Susa in the province of Elam: in the vision I was beside the Ulai Canal. I looked up, and there before me was a ram with two horns, standing beside the canal, and the horns were long.... New International Version (NIV),

Daniel 8: 1-3

As Daniel experienced this vision, he saw a person standing before him and a voice calling, "Gabriel, tell this man the meaning of this vision." (Daniel 8:16) Gabriel reveals and brings reassurance as well as interprets dreams and visions.

Zachariah was also visited by Gabriel,

The angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zachariah; Your prayer has been answered. Your wife Elizabeth will bear a son and you are to give him the name John... I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God..." NIV, Luke 1:13-19

Zachariah's response was just like what our response to a dream or vision might be: "How can I be sure of this?"

Joseph was visited by Gabriel in a dream, as we will hear in the Gospel reading on the fourth Sunday in Advent.

...an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

NIV, Matthew 1:20-21

And what did Joseph do? When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. Imagine the possibilities if we followed the guidance of our dreams – our Letters from God? (Haden, Unopened Letters from God, 2010)

And finally, Gabriel visits Mary as we read in the Gospel of Luke.

... the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

NIV, Luke 1:30-32

And Mary asks....."How can this be....." and then replies, "I am the Lord's servant," "May your word to me be fulfilled." Mary embraces this vision and follows the path revealed.

I think it is important to note that Gabriel says to Zachariah, Joseph and Mary, "Do not be afraid." Fear can keep us from embracing the wisdom of our dreams and visions, even though we know that our dreams come for our health and wholeness – every time. As Jeremy Taylor reminds us – A dream never comes to tell us something we already know, and the dreamer is

the only one who can say with certainty what meanings a dream holds (p. 3).

If you are looking for a way to honor this season of Advent – a beautiful time of longing, expectation, and even surprise – I encourage you to begin keeping a dream journal. Allow yourself to slow down a bit before jumping out of bed in the morning to recall dreams, images and symbols. (When we jump right out of bed into our day, dreams, symbols and images can be easily forgotten!) After you get out of bed, take a few minutes to journal your dream - first person. Don't worry about not remembering the whole dream or about missing a part of the dream. just journal every part you do remember, or even just the image or symbol revealed to you in your dream. Notice what symbols, images and metaphors are revealed to you. And remember, Do not be afraid dreams come to us for our health and wholeness every time, and never come to tell us something we already know.

Vestry Job Description

The vestry of Saint Andrew is responsible, along with the rector, for advancing the mission of our parish, which calls us to be open in spirit, deep in faith, rich in worship, and active in service. Each

year we nominate new candidates for the open positions on the vestry.

The vestry welcomes and thrives on diversity in background, and many different qualifications and life experiences can make for an effective vestry member. Listed below are some general attributes and qualifications for vestry members:

- Possess enthusiasm for the mission and ministry of St. Andrew and personal spiritual maturity;
- Are communicants in good standing*, have been active in our parish life, and are regular worshipers and contributors;
- Are able and willing to make the necessary commitment of time and talent to serve as a member and/or liaison to at least one committee/work group in addition to regular attendance at monthly vestry meetings, parish events, and worship;
- Understand and participate in the vestry's stewardship efforts;
- Are willing to speak their mind, honor the opinions of others, vote their conscience, and work toward consensus;
- Are appreciative of differences in perspective and communication style and responsive to the diversity of the group.

Canons of the Episcopal Church *Canon 1.17.1

Sec. 1 (a) All persons who have received the Sacrament of Holy Baptism with water in the Name of the

Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, whether in this Church or in another Christian Church, and whose Baptisms have been duly recorded in this Church, are **members** thereof.

Canon 1.17

Sec. 3. All communicants of this Church, who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, are to be considered **communicants in good standing**.
