A NOTE FROM THE BENCH

Advent Greetings!

Advent is a wonderful time to reflect on what it means to be a dreamer, and to live as one who dreams. We see countless examples of what it means to be a dreamer recorded in scripture through the examples of Elizabeth, John the Baptist, Mary, Joseph, Simeon and Anna – as well as the shepherds in the fields and the Magi too. Each was open to receiving and discerning God's dreams for the world. Advent is a time of invitation

for us to be open to receiving and living out God's dreams for the world in our lives, at St. Andrew, Mentor, and in the world we inhabit.

Biblical dream theory, according to Savary, Berne, and Kaplan-Williams (1984), is that *God makes contact with people through dreams and visions* (p.16). They note that if a dream were a letter, there must be a sender – our connection to the Divine. The word dream appears 87 times in the Old Testament, and 8 times in the New Testament. In addition, the word vision appears 86 times in the Old Testament and 17 times in the New Testament.

One of the visions we hear about this Advent is found in Luke's Gospel.

In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to Joseph.... the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid. Mary... you will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give the child the name Jesus."

The archangel Gabriel appears in dreams and visions in both the Old and New Testaments – an archetypal figure transcending time and space. Gabriel brings the message of the birth of John the Baptist as well, appearing to Zacheriah in the temple. Gabriel is a revealer and bringer of reassurance,

as well as interpreter of dreams (Haden, 2010).

Another gift of Advent is moving from darkness toward light (of Christ). One of my favorite authors, Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor, Episcopal priest and professor says there are many things she has learned in the darkness that she could not have learned in light – and describes looking for a celestial brightness, and almost missing it because it didn't look as she expected it to look (p. 121) what might we miss this Advent season because it doesn't look just as we thought it would look? A dream? A vision? Our call to serve? The birth of Jesus? We tend to want to avoid our own inner darkness. How might some of our beliefs about darkness need to be changed? How can this Advent, with all its visions and dreamers invite us to be dreamers too, discerning God's dreams for the world, and then doing something to help live out God's dreams in the world?

Carl Jung, the founder of analytical psychology says, As far as we can discern, the sole purpose of human existence is to kindle a light in the darkness of mere being. May this be our call this Advent – to **be** that light the world so desperately needs, discerning and sharing God's dreams for the world.

Rank on rank the host of heaven spreads its vanguard on the way, as the Light of Light descendeth from the realms of endless day, that the powers of hell may vanish as the darkness clears away.
