### From the Rector

Update on Fourth Sundays Initiative

Friends, in last month's newsletter I introduced a possible Sunday fellowship experiment that will bring old friends and new friends together around the brunch table to connect/reconnect, share the love of God with one another, and learn something new. I sent out a survey, you responded favorably, and so it's a go for Sunday October 22!

Fourth Sundays is worship with a particular emphasis on fellowship. Begin the morning at 9:30 am with a quiet Morning Prayer in the nave, or go straight to brunch in the parish hall at 10:30. Enjoy the food, sing along with the music, and enjoy the company of your siblings in Christ. As brunch is winding down, you'll have the opportunity to learn with your hands, your mind, your heart, and your imagination. We'll have a service option (rake leaves, stock the food pantry, change light bulbs, whatever needs doing), and a learning option.

That's it. Join us for some of our Fourth Sunday options or do a deep dive into the Fourth Sunday initiative. We'll tweak it as we go, and your participation, and your feedback, and your loving hearts will make Fourth Sundays a success.

If you've not been with us for a while, we hope you'll give Fourth Sunday a try. It will be good to be together!

### FINANCE COMMITTEE

Hello from your Finance Committee and Vestry! We just wanted to provide a brief update on our parish finances for the good of the order. It has been very uplifting to see all of the creativity and effort brought forth the past 6 months. We've had several successful fundraising events (bocce, junk-in-the-trunk sale, concert) with more events to come. With the help of a professional accountant, we've also established a reasonable repayment plan for Lisa's accidental salary overpayment that occurred in the first half of the year. We are about



a month into that plan, and Lisa should be all back to even in June of 2024.

All of the church's bills (with the exception of one) are paid and up to date. The one exception is our diocesan assessment. If you're not familiar, the assessment is money that each diocesan parish is asked to pay to the diocese every month. Back in February we made the

decision to postpone assessment payments as we worked to get a handle on our finances. Assessment payments are significant expense (10%-15% of our annual operating budget). As of today, we are deciding to continue to postpone assessment payments. We felt this was the most responsible course of action for the time being, given that the fall/winter usually brings increased costs for heating and snow removal. Being behind on assessment payments means that we will not be able to have a vote at the Diocesan Convention in November. While this is regrettable, we still feel this is the best course of action for our parish for the short-term.



# A NOTE FROM THE BENCH

October Greetings,

Oh Lord, it's time, it's time. It was a great summer.

Lay your shadow now on the sundials.

and on the open fields let the winds go!

Rainer Maria Rilke, Autumn Day, translated by Robert Bly, 1981

Rilke invites the soul, as the season begins to change, to prepare to honor our ancestors – the saints and beloved of God. This time of harvest leads us to the celebration of All Saints' and All Soul's Day, which is, according to Celtic tradition, a *thin time*. A *thin time* is a time at which heaven and earth feel close, with beautiful moments during which we connect to those who have gone before (Valters Paintner, 2023).

To the Celts, threshold, or thin times, are closely related to the world moving from dark to light and back to dark again, coinciding with the seasons. The thin times in Celtic tradition include eight threshold moments of the year. Samhain begins the dark half of the year in Celtic tradition, and falls on November 1, All Saints' Day, which the Celts believe to be the thinnest time. Our ancestors, and all the saints and beloved of God walk

close beside us as the threshold door between heaven and earth opens wider, it seems, at this time, than at other threshold times. The dark half of the year, beginning with Samhain, is a time of rest, incubation and mystery (Valters Paintner, 2023). The dark half of the year is a *dreamtime*, an

invitation to open our hearts to those who have gone before.

Christine Valters Paintner points out in her latest book, *The Love of Thousands: How Angels, Saints, and Ancestors Walk with us Toward Holiness* (Sorin, 2023), that in Western culture we often neglect our ancestral heritage (p.81). In other cultures, she notes, remembering our ancestors is "an intuitive and essential way of beginning anything new." (p. 81). Valters Paintner encourages us to recognize the wisdom we can draw from those who have traveled before us.

The question is always, How do I hear and receive the wisdom of ancestors, the saints and beloved of God? One way is to pay close attention to dreams.

Justina Lasley, 2004, as cited in Hoss, 2005, notes that the "most effective form of dreamwork comes from one's own intuition and inner wisdom" (p. 29). Lasley believes that along with faith, we need to observe the guiding force in our dreams — those (often unopened) letters received from God. I have been blessed to hear many accounts of ancestors visiting their loved ones, particularly at this thinnest of the threshold times — Samhain, All Saints' and All Soul's.

Robert Hoss (2005) notes the reports of many seeing and speaking with loved ones who have gone before in their dreams. Hoss notes

that in some cases the ancestor who has gone before reveals some information that the dreamer has no knowledge of previously. Robert Moss, creator of *Active Dreaming*, (2005), reports visitation dreams of counsel and information, or urgent warning or health advisory, and even to alert us to the location of a missing document. Moss notes that the visitation of those who have gone before in a dream can be a precognitive dream as well -- one that will be played out sometime in the future.

As we enter this time of harvest, and approach Samhain, All Saints' and All Soul's Days, may we be aware of the invitation of our dreams. Robert Haden (2010) reminds us that the ancient Hebrews and Christians believed that one of the *primary* ways God speaks to God's people is through dreams – **the primary way!** Third century Babylonian sage Rabbi Hisda reminds us that "A dream uninterpreted is like a letter (from God) unopened" (p. 1).

### The Blessings of Our Ancestors

This blessing calls you home again to your collective inheritance of blood and bone, calls you to dance with generations who shimmer beyond the veil. We call on the great cloud of witnesses, the ones who inspire our courage, support our endurance, kindle our joy, whisper words of hope. May the wise and well ones, who are vibrant and radiant with healing, who have stepped into the expanse of love without hesitation, whose hearts are open wide, shower you with their blessing so you know your ancient inheritance. Stand at the threshold and whisper some of their names, grandmothers and grandfathers,

back through hundreds and thousands of years prayers and supplications for all that helps you navigate this world with ease. May they form a circle of protection around you to guard from anything that would wish you harm. Open the eyes of your heart to see they are already here, already dancing through your feet, your hips, your hands, the embrace of your arms, the undulations of your spine, the smile on your lips. This blessing dances in the threshold space with you, at the turning of dawn or dusk, helping your heart stay open, attuned, to the wisdom pouring forth. Sing aloud of gratitude and ask them to surround you, knowing they are already present, it is only your vision that must
