### A Note about Palm Sunday

Our Palm Sunday Liturgy is on April 10th. We will celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with just one Holy Eucharist at 10:30 AM. Please gather in the Narthex for the Procession of the Palms. The service will end with the reading of the Passion, as we prepare for Holy Week.

### Watch & Pray

On Maundy Thursday (April 14) following the 7 PM service, we invite you to spend an hour watching and praying. The traditional Prayer Vigil will take place overnight at the church. You may either come to the church where the altar of repose will be located in the Narthex, or pray from home, as we commemorate Jesus' time in the Garden of Gethsemane before his crucifixion, His plea to the disciples was "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation." Can you watch and pray for an hour? A sign-up sheet is available in the Narthex.

### Update to Mask Policy

After careful consideration, the Rector and Vestry of St. Andrew have decided that face masks are **optional** for worship and all parish functions. Anyone who wishes to continue to mask and/or distance for reasons of personal safety will be respected and supported.

Please share your questions, answers and most of all your imaginations so that we all together as a parish might "witness to Christ in the world using the gifts the Spirit" gives to ALL of us.
