August is upon us and with it comes the need to review and organize our parish worship, Christian education, and building maintenance schedules for the upcoming program year. Worship and Christian Education plans are underway. After much time away from in-person worship in our sacred space, some of us are noticing maintenance and repair issues in the building and around the grounds that need attention. Our goal, always, in worship, education, and outreach is to serve each other in love, serve our neighbors in love, and create community together. How do our church building and grounds contribute to our worship, sharing, and community-building? What should our funding priorities be in pursuing the preservation and improvement of our church building and parish grounds? What funds are available to us as a parish to do this work?

These are all critical questions for us to ask and answer together as we seek to preserve our beloved church building and prepare for our future in all spheres of ministry.

In this issue of our newsletter we will share updated information about outstanding parish projects and current resources. We will give you an update on some ongoing maintenance needs, and we will provide information about the current status of our endowment fund, which has grown significantly in the last year and a half, to such an extent that we'll be able to access interest from the fund for current needs.

Sunday School is Back in September

St. Andrew's Sunday School program will resume for children ages 3 through third grade on Sunday, September 12th. Amy Dittebrand will once again lead the class. Each week children will learn lessons, make crafts, color and continue to learn about God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Sunday school class begin each Sunday at 10:25 AM. Children will rejoin their families at Holy Eucharist when the congregation passes the peace.

For the safety of our children, both teachers and children will wear masks for indoor classes. Cloth Masks will be made available for the use of our children in class and may be taken home after class for future use.

Children younger than 3 are welcome to visit the St. Andrew Nursery. Brianna Rotz will once again be shepherding our youngest members and leading them in free play.

St. Andrew Endowment Fund

The St. Andrew Endowment Fund was created in 2010 with generous donations from members of the congregation who either made a one-time gift or included the church in their legacy plans. The fund was established to provide a permanent source of income through earnings from the investment. To that end, the St. Andrew Endowment Board (established by the Vestry to manage the fund), invested those donations in the Diocese of Ohio Joint Investment Fund.

Over the years, memorial gifts and interest have gradually added to the fund which now totals \$200,726. The fund has grown significantly this year due to a generous gift left by Jeane Beardsley at her passing.

While much of the interest is being reinvested back into the fund to help make the future of St. Andrew more secure, the Vestry can now access some of the interest income to help fund projects and maintain the church while adhering to protocols established at the fund's inception.

Most recently Memorial gifts made in memory of Sandy Sandacz were added to the fund at the family's request. Our thanks to the Sandacz/ Herczog family and those who donated in Sandy's memory.

We are blessed with great abundance here at St. Andrew and our greatest blessing is our loving community of souls which meets together in our sacred space and nourishes us abundantly by love. I am grateful to be among you and look forward to all the seasons to come.

Maintenance and Repair Priorities From the Senior Warden

The following major projects are likely necessary soon.

- Replace the two remaining roof sections
- Replace the remaining windows excluding the sanctuary.
- Repave and restripe the entire parking lot
- Install A/C in classroom wing and Worman Room
- Remove, strip, refinish, and rehang front entry doors
- Repair front entry steps and handrail

In addition, lots of minor work is needed including replacing the carpeting in the Worman Room, and replacing the exterior door in that room. The lighting in the hallway from the Worman Room to the assembly room needs upgrading. Sanctuary lighting needs upgrading to LED. Ventilation in the Sacristy needs upgrading (there currently isn't any).

We should be spending about \$40-\$60K per year on recurring maintenance in order to proactively address our ongoing repair and maintenance needs.* *For reference, Our 2021 parish budget line for building and grounds is \$15,000, \$7,700 of which was spent as of June 2021.

Office windows will be replaced soon! Hallelujah!

Window Replacement Update

History: The St. Andrew Window Project began in 2018 with the goal of replacing all the windows in the Education/Office wing. Many of the windows are over 50 years-old dating back to when the church was originally constructed. Due to the considerable expense, the project was expected to continue for several years.

With generous donations from church members, we raised \$15,513 by the end of 2018 and started replacing windows the next year, starting with windows in the rear assembly room and choir vesting rooms, This room was considered most critical due to broken latches allowing windows to blow open in all seasons! The improvement due to the new windows has been amazing! Not only are they beautiful, but they are energy efficient!

Later in the fall of 2019, additional funds were spent to replace the Worman Room kitchen window at cost of \$2,366. Due to non-standard sizes, all replacement windows must be custom made.

Happening Now: After a very generous donation by a St. Andrew parishioner, the Vestry authorized spending another \$37,470 on the project. Soon work will begin to replace all the office wing windows PLUS the large classroom windows on the north side of the building.

What's Left?: Vestry members estimate the need for an additional \$22,000 to replace the remaining classroom windows on the south side of the Education Wing, plus the Worman Room windows. The Worman Room windows will cost approximately \$14,000 (2020 estimate). We thank all who have generously donated, and look forward to completing the project soon. Can you help?
