From the Rector

The sixth Sunday of Easter is also Rogation Sunday. Rogationtide, as many of you know, are the three days prior to Ascension Day in the Christian calendar. This year, Ascension Day is May 13. When I was in seminary, we were required to write the bishop on rogation days-which inspired me and challenged me in equal measure. Rogationtide anxiety was "a thing" for more than a few seminarians, myself included.

Inspiration and challenge are fitting sentiments with which to enter into Rogation Days. The tradition began in France during the fifth century during a time when that country was threatened by Goth invasions, and the common people struggled to plant, tend, and harvest the crops to keep their families and communities alive. In response to these challenges, St. Mamertus of Vienne created special liturgies to be prayed in procession in the fields where people cultivated the soil in order to give thanks for the land and the bounty of the earth, and to bless the fields in anticipation of another season of planting, growth, and harvest. This liturgical custom of walking the bounds of the parish (parish being the entire perimeter of a village and not just the church yard proper), and asking for God's blessing and protection over the land, helped people remember the presence of the holy in their work. These liturgies, performed by communities on their land, in a sense sanctified their agricultural labors done for the health and nourishment of all.

What is Pentecost?

"The term means "the fiftieth day." It is used in both the OT and the NT. In the OT it refers to a feast of seven weeks known as the Feast of Weeks. It was apparently an agricultural event that focused on the harvesting of first fruits. Josephus referred to Pentecost as the fiftieth day after the first day of Passover. The term is used in the NT to refer to the coming of the Spirit on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1), shortly after Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension. Christians came to understand the meaning of Pentecost in terms of the gift of the Spirit. The Pentecost event was the fulfillment of a promise which Jesus gave concerning the return of the Holy Spirit. The speaking in tongues, which was a major effect of having received the Spirit, is interpreted by some to symbolize the church's worldwide preaching. In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is now the seventh Sunday after Easter. It emphasizes that the church is understood as the body of Christ which is drawn together and given life by the Holy Spirit."

An Update On Resuming Singing

With warm weather coming and the increased opportunity to hold services outside, we (the Diocese of Ohio) will adjust our protocols beginning Sunday, May 23, the Day of Pentecost, to allow a choir of up to four singers who are masked, socially distanced, and fully vaccinated (two weeks after final prescribed dose) to offer music in outdoor worship only. All must continue to mask and can softly sing or hum while masked.

Additionally, an outdoor, COVID-safe coffee hour may be held, but all food and drinks must be prepackaged and all must be consumed outdoors.
