Windows Update:

New windows have been installed in the large Sunday School/meeting room and office area. Thank you to all who have donated to the window fund!

Next steps: The Vestry estimates the need for an additional \$22,000 to replace the remaining classroom windows on the south side of the Education Wing, plus the Worman Room windows. The Worman Room windows will cost approximately \$14,000 (2020 estimate).


Voices Found
