From the Rector

Friends, soon we will begin together the good work of exploring *Sacred Ground: A Film-based Dialogue Series on Race & Faith*. This highly-acclaimed Episcopal Church initiative is said to be life-changing, and I for one cannot wait to get started on this 10 week series with you. We will begin our journey on February 18, when I will share the learning materials with you. Our first dialogue group will be on Thursday March 4 at 6:30pm when we will meet via Zoom.

The films and reading materials will be available to you online at no cost, to read/view at your leisure, and our dialogue group will be meeting twice a month (via zoom for now), to talk about the learning, ask questions, share stories and ponder how the human-created concept of “race” has impacted the course of human history in this country.

We will explore together how to respond, as Christians and as the faith community, to the pervasive effects of racism which remain so prevalent in our time, and how to move forward together to create an inclusive beloved community grounded in peace and justice for all of God’s people.

Because of the complexity of the issues to be explored, and our need to process our learning together, our first dialogue group will be limited to 10 people. If there is interest, we will offer the series again, and continue these offerings so that everyone can participate in a dialog group and learn together.

Ash Wednesday February 17

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent and is an opportunity for Christians to renew their repentance and faith. The imposition of ashes reminds us that God created us out of the dust of the earth and that we will return to that dust. The ashes are a sign of our mortality and penitence. It is only through the gift of Jesus that we have everlasting life.

Join us virtually via Facebook or YouTube as we begin our observance of a Holy Lent on Wednesday, February 17th. Plans are being made to create "at home" ash kits for self imposition of ashes during the online Ash Wednesday Liturgy. Watch your email for more information and instructions.
